

## Going on a San Francisco Bay Area Duck Hunt! Sunday, March 3, 2013 - trip leader Lisa Myers

Quick Overview – This was the first Let's Go Birding "Duck Hunt" in 2 years. The San Francisco Bay Area provides us with all kinds of water habitats so we get all kinds of different ducks, but, this trip is more than just a duck trip. We run into many different species of birds as we work our way through freshwater reservoirs, ponds, streams, salt water tidal lands and more. We ended our day with over 90 species including 17 different ducks! Our first stop was a fresh water percolation pond which included our first 7 duck species for the day. We then headed to higher ground where the secluded Stevens Creek Reservoir provides the ideal home for a day's target species, the elusive Wood Ducks. We found about 8 and even had a chance to watch a pair fly off together. Mountain View's Shoreline Lake was next. With a mix of both salt & fresh water this lake always turns up great species. Here we found the wintering Common Goldeneye x Bufflehead hybrid in addition to Surf Scoters & Greater Scaup. Cedar Waxwings & American Coots were also found here in numbers. We kept the pace going as we headed out to the open spaces next to Moffett Field. Our plan was to walk the levee out to pond "A2E" where more great birds had been reported. Our walk was filled with other avian observations. Red Tailed Hawks chased after a Golden Eagle and Northern Harriers vocalized and put on an impressive aerial display. Common Yellowthroat, Marsh Wren, Lincoln Sparrow, White Tailed Kites, Say's Phoebe, Western Meadowlark; they were all here. We also got to watch parachuters jumping out of military aircraft! When we came to the ponds we added Red Breasted Merganser in addition to teals and more. From here we stopped for lunch at one un-eventful location and then moved on to visit a new open space called Cooley Landing. Vacant land once closed to the public is now a cleaned up, public space providing habitat for birds and people. The tide was out and the shorebirds were found in large numbers, but no new ducks. This was the first time most in the group had ever visited

this spot. It was time to end the trip, so we made one last stop & added Cinnamon Teal, our last
