Quick Overview – This was the 12th year for the "Gallinago Go Go's" to bird in the SFBBO California Fall Challenge. This year I said we'd stop just as soon as we found our 100 species and we did at 4:00 PM. As always, we use minimal to no recordings of bird calls as we seek out each species by visiting different habitats. We started at 7:00 AM in Los Gatos as we started with 24 species in the oak woodland habitat of Rinconada Park. We made a guick stop in Vasona County Park and added guite a few birds when a mixed flock flew overhead. After that we headed north to Sunnyvale Baylands Park. We found more birders than birds, but we added a few nice species for our day. Next, the Sunnyvale Water Pollution Control Plant where we decided we would do the ½ mile walk out to see the Sabine's Gull. While we knew a Parasitic Jaeger was in another pond the group decided they'd rather eat than walk another levee so we headed to Alviso. After lunch we worked our way around the various ponds of the area and found the shorebirds we needed, an adult Golden Eagle and a pair of Peregrine Falcons. Our last stop had us checking out the open space known as the Arzino Ranch where we stopped to find Long Billed Curlew, Say's Phoebe, Burrowing owl, American Kestrel and Western Meadowlark allowing us to end our day with a final count of 103
