## San Francisco Bay Bird Observatory's California Fall Challenge 2013

Quick Overview – This was the 11<sup>th</sup> year for the "Gallinago Go Go's" to bird in the SFBBO California Fall Challenge. As always, we want to find a minimum of 100 species, raise money for SFBBO and have a great time. We use minimal to no recordings of bird calls as we seek out each species by visiting different habitats, looking throughout the landscape, listening and pishing the old fashioned way! We started at 7:30 AM in Mountain View off Terminal Blvd. and walked around Coast Casey Forebay. The hunting Peregrine Falcon was a wonderful way to start our day. We then stopped off at the Palo Alto Baylands and then Geng Road before leaving this area with 70 species under our belt. The Geng Road stop proved very fruitful as warblers and passerines were abundant. Alviso was our next stop providing us with Burrowing Owl and our first Golden Eagle. Ed Levin was next providing different habitat & new species including a first of the season Red Breasted Sapsucker. We

decided we would work our way back via Felter. Marsh and Sierra roads. Our efforts got us Horned Larks, Savannah & Lark Sparrows, shrike & mappies. Only a few species short of a 100, we dropped down to Shoreline Lake and found new species in pond A1 plus the Surf Scoters missed earlier. And before returning to our cars on Terminal Blvd. we found the Pectoral Sandpiper in the forebay. However, our last bird of the day was a female House Sparrow #104
