

Final Trip Report – Joseph D. Grant County Park

Spring birding with snow on the hills! May 15, 2011

Quick Overview – All the weather reports said the Sunday morning temperatures would be 25 degrees below normal with snow falling as low as 4,000 feet! How could this be - it's May in California! Sure enough, when we arrived to Joseph Grant Ranch County Park we started our birding in 42 degrees which is indeed record lows for this time of year. And when the clouds lifted we saw snow surrounding the Mtn. Hamilton peak and the James Lick Observatory. Despite the unusual weather the group was eager to find target birds and we found them! We started at Grant Lake and found a pair of Green Herons hunting the water's edge along with a Caspian Tern which was also searching for a meal. Flocks of Violet Green Swallows were also found in the air and also perched in several trees along the shore. Watching a pair of American Crows go after a pair of Ravens provided a great study on the two Corvids. From here we worked our way into the park where we soon found a beautiful male Yellow Warbler and a Western Kingbird before heading off to the Snell Trail. Lazuli Buntings were the common bird along our walk and learning to ID this bird by ear became easier and easier. We shared the trail with horses & mules as an equestrian competition was underway. The riders were curious to learn what we were doing and we shared some of our observations. We ended our morning birding the gardens around the Grant Ranch House. I thank everyone for braving the weather and getting to enjoy a part of San Jose that remains open and green for all to enjoy.
