

Final Trip Report – In search of Mountain Plovers Solano County, January 4, 2014 - Trip Leader – Lisa Myers



Quick Overview – There is an area north/east of the Benicia Bridge and west of Rio Vista that birders always check for wintering Mountain Plovers; an area where grassland still remains. The last report was in December 2013 & this trip was all about looking for this elusive plover. While we observed Tundra Swans & Canada Geese, Red-tailed Hawks, American Kestrels and a Rough-legged Hawk while in route, we did not stop to bird until we reached the corner of Robinson & Flannery. Not aware of its presence, we flushed a Burrowing Owl just getting out of the cars. This would be the first of two we found during our day. We slowly drove the farm roads around this open habitat and while we found Meadowlarks, Northern Flickers and many Loggerhead Shrikes we were never able to find our target species. A beautiful flock of Lark Sparrows helped ease the pain and we found a few more Rough-legged Hawks, some Ferruginous Hawks & Long-billed Curlew during our search. This is the driest winter California has had in decades and all are asking how this is affecting the birds. We found evidence throughout our day where the ranchers have to feed their cattle as there is little in the fields to eat. We eventually worked our way to a waterway next to the Sacramento River which allowed us to add species that find their home in & around water. This was the first time many in the group had ever been to this part of Solano County and now all know the way back for future exploration. Thank you all for joining in the search.
